REPORTS

Dr. Lynn Brookins, FCS Program Leader

Western Region has received the Methodist Le Bonheur Community Outreach Grant which was awarded to six counties: McNairy, Lake, Henderson, Madison, Weakley, and Hardin. This is a three year grant focusing on improved access to

services for at-risk children, youth, and adults for chronic diseases, including diabetes and obesity.

Crockett, Haywood, Decatur, and Henderson Counties hosted their first kickoff event for the CDC High Obesity Grant. This grant will focus on developing a plan for food security, accessibility to safe environments, and health related programs throughout the county. Focus groups will be established to determine needs and implementation efforts throughout these counties.

Western Region FCE had a very successful competition in Fashion Revue at the 2023 TAFCE Conference in Kingsport. From Obion County, Alice Fennel placed first in Categories 9, 10, and 15, and second in Category 11. Nadine Killion, also from Obion County, placed first in Category 14 and second in Categories 1 and 12. Barbara Beeman, Montgomery County, placed second in Category 16, while Elenora Mallory, Montgomery County, placed second in Category 6. Kathy Hulley, Decatur County, was first in Category 2, and first place in Category 8 was Zena Swendiman, Dickson County.

Fashion Revue for 2024 does have some changes. The apron category is divided into two categories. Embellished Aprons is new, and the aprons in this category may be purchased then embellished. Aprons Constructed is a separate category in 2024. The personal data sheet has been revised and should be easier to complete. It is most important that the data sheet accompany the Fashion Revue Winner Entry Form. Both forms from each county should be sent to Janie Jones by July 1 for Mini-Conference competition August 6.
